

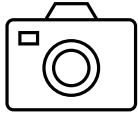

Architecture Photography

Why?

- Its not a building - its a piece of art – it's a social statement
- It's a landscape but with context, character and personality
- Its the whole, the part or the abstract
- Its the story it tells that's important

How?

- Tilt shift lenses - **very** expensive
- You need a good wide angle lens – The wider the better – Use it well!
- Find the picture you've seen everybody take then find the picture they missed
- Most of the time you cant use a tripod
- Often it pays to go as low as you can or force the perspective
- Take a picture of something else – the building will not go away
- Don't shoot too tight you need processing space
- Read the floor as flag stones and markings will help you find centre points
- Don't get run over or mugged

What (else)?

- What do Camera club judges think?
 - Not in vogue
 - Always need people, a cat or a pigeon in the shot - WHY!
 - Always try to categorise it (This is a record shot) - WHY!
 - Some are even a little afraid of it !
- Fantastic for monochrome
- You can develop a real style of your own
- Don't miss out on some great shots because you walk past buildings
- You can build up a problem relationship with some buildings !

Street Photography

Why?

- Its real
- You can capture the soul of the person, the event or the place
- It will and must tell a story
- It can sometimes feel uncomfortable or intrusive
- Transport the viewer to that place

How?

- Two Types
 - Melee – wide lens point and shoot – capture the whole – hit and miss
 - Isolation – long lens – capture the individual - Deliberate
- Three Styles
 - Capture the person
 - Find a background and wait for the person
 - Find the light and wait for the person
- Environmental street photography - Judges get confused because they want to classify images!
It's a person / It's a building?But is it a good photograph?

What (else)?

- What do Camera club judges think?
 - They forget you have captured just one moment in time !
 - They favour the melee style !
 - A lot are very afraid of it !
- Fantastic for monochrome
- Shoot at about 1/200 as you will get foot movement
- Take plenty of test shots of the location – before a person arrives
- Covert or ask for the shot???
- Don't get run over or mugged
